

Cadence of a Deep Call: a Call to Major in Major Things

From time to time I have been requested by our church families or residents in our community to preach on certain topics or various social problems of today such as Obama Care, homosexuality, racism, sexism, classism, abortion, capital punishment, just war, stem cell research, church and state, etc. Some people as Christians want to know what its right and wrong on certain issues. Some others want to hear what they want to hear from me. Some think the main concern of the religion is the application of its truth to these social problems and to teach the people what to do. I don't believe that's what I have been called for or why Jesus came.

Some others believe religion is all about knowing the right answers to the right questions. To them the basis of the religious faith is catechism. Therefore, many children have been faithfully taught the questions and the answers of the catechism by their parents and teachers. But, when these children go to college, what happens to them? Many times these intellectual teachings do not have impact on them anymore. It does not make any difference in them. It is not enough just to be able to answer the questions. Truth must be a part of our experience, or hearts, and our soul.

There are still some others who believe that true religion consists of understanding why we act as we act, and the emphasis has been on the study of man and the problem of evil. They approach religion from the perspective of human behavior. They believe the most important thing in religion is to understand human behavior and to have a solution for that.

But, none of these are the main purpose of our faith. The most important purpose of our religion is to go to heaven. Jesus did not come to give us moral teachings on racism, sexism, classism, homosexuality, abortion, etc. That is not why he came for; that is not why he died! He died for our sins to give us the eternal life. He came to give us more joy. Most of all, he came to save our lives.

Today in the United States we have a tendency to think of our Lord as a wise teacher, social reformer or philanthropist. But he is more than that. He is first our Savior. Jesus did not die for the social issues, moral issues, or some other matters that come and go. Jesus died for our sins while we were yet sinners. That is the gospel. That is my calling to save as many people as I can. We are called to major in major things in life. Jesus is the major thing!

HOLY WEEK SERVICES





The youth group has continued to grow in fellowship and fun together. Our most recent outing included a night out at Planet Fun playing laser tag and bowling.






