

Cadence of a Deep Call: a Call to Bring the Best of Ourselves

Human beings are very odd creatures. We are full of contradictions and paradoxes. We are at the same time very good and very bad. We can be spiritual and animalistic. We have good and evil inside us. We are saints and sinners, light and darkness, angels and demons. Saint Paul, who wrote many of the books of the New Testament, confessed his evil side in his letters to the Romans: "I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing that I hate." (Romans 7:15)

How do we deal with these two seemingly contradictory qualities in ourselves? Many of the Pharisees tried to think of themselves as more than they were. They believed they were more righteous, more spiritual and more religious than anybody else and treated all others with judgment and prejudice. Jesus rebuked their religious superiority and cocky attitudes over and over again. As a matter of fact, over ninety percent of Jesus' sermons were intended to make them realize who they truly were and how bad they all were. One of the prime examples of Jesus' reprimands against the Pharisees was when they were ready to stone the woman who was caught in the very act of committing adultery. He told them, "Let anyone without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." (John 8:7)

On the other hand, Jesus always embraced such sinners as tax collectors, prostitutes and adulterers who thought of themselves as the worst of all. He sat down with them, ate with them, drank with them, and laughed with them. He lifted them up by saying, "Truly, you are one of the descendants of Abraham." (Luke 19:9) "Your faith has made you well." (Luke 17:19) "Woman, great is your faith." (Matthew 15:28)


Cadence of a Deep Call: a Call to Bring the Best of Ourselves (con't.)


GREECE TRIP PLANNED FOR 2019

Summer Kick Off at Ocean Isle Beach








OUTREACH NEWS






