

At this time of year, we would like to say thank you for your support of the work of the food pantry in helping our neighbors in need here in Brunswick County.

Because of your generosity, we have been fortunate enough to have served over 15,000 people in 4,009 households this year. This includes 4,265 children, 6,533 adults, and 4,410 senior adults. Our goal is to serve a three-day supply of nutritious emergency food based on the USDA recommended 2,000 calories per day. The total cost of this has been \$76,920 to date with \$74,095 or 96% of the funds going directly to the clients in food, baby items and personal toiletries. Our extremely low operational expense is due to the generosity of our volunteers paying their own expenses to travel to the Food Bank in Wilmington, and the generosity of local stores and storage units in providing total donations or discounts for their products. No one collects a salary nor are there rental expenses for the pantry space that has been graciously donated by Camp UMC since it's inception in 1998.

Eight of our member churches actively participate in the operation of the weekly pantry by volunteering their time and personal expense to travel to the Wilmington Food Bank, and over to the storage units we maintain in Shallotte to prepare for the Saturday morning distribution. All our twenty churches' members participate in our fundraisers like the Two Seasonal Variety Shows, the Half Marathon & 5K Run for Food on Ocean Isle Beach in January, Sunset at Sunset street fair in October, and CROP Walk in November. We also receive much needed financial support from community civic groups and organizations. Volunteers include School Athletic groups, Honor students, Senior Practicum students, Boy Scouts, Teen Court Students as well as adults.

Christmastime is a natural time to think of gifts as we follow the example of the Magi who brought gifts to the Christ child and we give each other gifts, but it is also a time to say thank you for those gifts that have already been given. So, "**THANK YOU** very much for the donations you have given to the SBIC Food Pantry this past year. We could not have served so many without your caring generosity."
