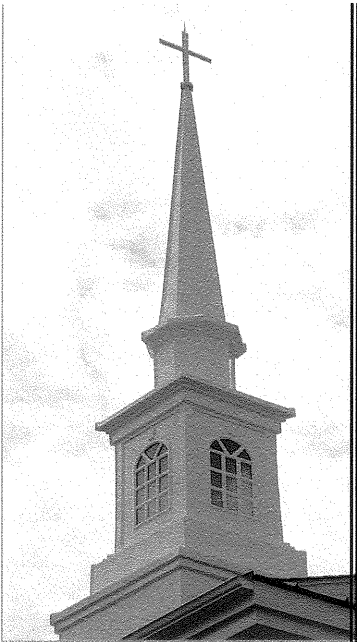

Cadence of a Deep Call: a Call to Forgive Ourselves

"How can I feel forgiven?" A woman in our community asked me. "Is it possible to feel completely forgiven? I have been in the church for over sixty years, but I have never felt my sins completely forgiven. I have heard my pastor preaching; Jesus died for my sins on the cross. But, I have not felt forgiven from the bondage of shame, guilt and regrets. Is there any way I can feel forgiven and be truly free?"

One of the main reasons why people don't feel forgiven is because they don't know there are several stages, layers of feelings, and multiple tiers to feel truly forgiven. Until we go through these several steps of forgiveness we will not feel forgiven completely.

The first stage is remorse. When the Holy Spirit touches our heart, he makes us grieve over the sins we have committed. I call this "good remorse." The Holy Spirit leads us to good remorse while the evil spirit makes us deny, make excuses, blame, or rationalize our sins. This stage is where many people fail to feel forgiven because they try to take their sins in their own ways, instead of God's ways. Some people try to numb their pains with drinks or drugs. Some others escape to harder working, hobbies, even religious activities. In extreme case some people take their own lives like Judas Iscariot.

But good remorse leads to next stage of forgiveness: confession. Confession is admitting that we have sinned. Confession means we acknowledge our own sins. Confession means we are helpless and we need a help and forgiveness. Confession means I take ownership of my sins, not blaming anybody else for my failure. When confession is genuine and authentic it leads to another stage to true forgiveness: repentance.

Repentance is more than feeling sorry. Repentance means turning around. It means not only feeling sorry to ourselves and God, but changing our directions to new life. It is turning toward the new ways, new values, new beginnings to God. When repentance is practiced we feel our sins are truly pardoned and forgiven.

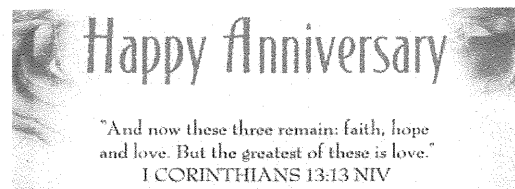
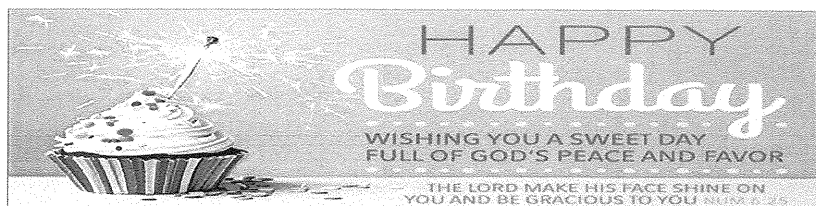
The last one is absolution. Absolution means to declare forgiveness of our sins in Jesus' name. We need to hear from God, from our brothers and sisters in Christ, from ourselves that our sins are forgiven. That is why we say to one another in our Holy Communion, "In the name of Jesus Christ you are forgiven." Then, the true peace of forgiveness comes to our hearts only after we have gone through all these spiritual stages to forgiveness.

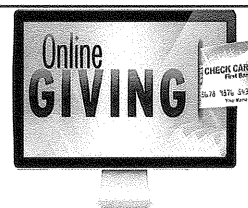

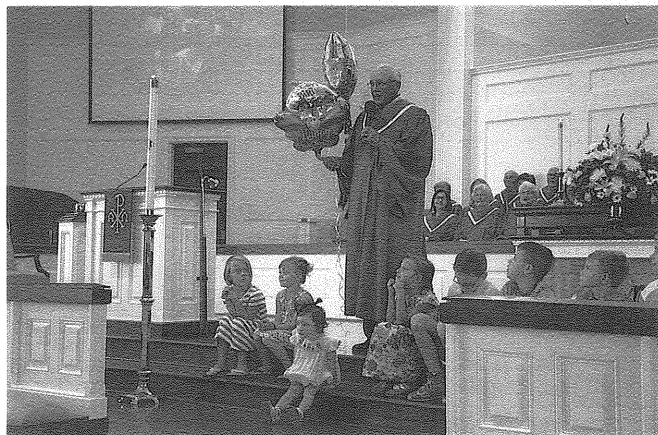

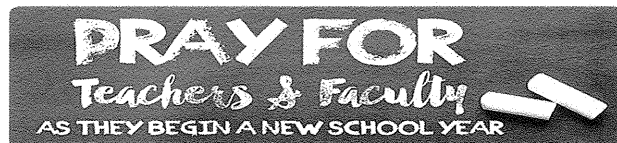
Fellowship and Dinner will begin at 5:00 p.m.
