Cadence of a Deep Call: a Call to Believe in the Communion of Saints

Sometimes people wonder what happens to the deceased; did they disappear forever in the handful of dust after cremation or are they still sleeping until Jesus comes back in final glory? Do their spirits hover around us until they find their final resting place? Are they working or are they resting? Will I recognize my loved ones in heaven? Where are they? What are they doing? These questions have puzzled many people, leaving them with half doubt and half faith.

There is no greater comfort in this life than to know and believe in the communion of saints. Several years ago my friend, Warren McIntyre, died in the Lord. His solid, biblical conviction in eternal life blessed me in such a way that I am deeply convinced about my own eternal life and that of others who have died in the Lord. Warren told me that he feels the presence of his parents around him. Even though they died, they did not. They are always with me, keeping me safe. In the same way, when I die, I want to be a guardian angel for my granddaughter, Megan.

I wholeheartedly agree with Warren when I heard him expressing his wishes. In our confession of the Apostles' Creed it says, "we believe in the communion of saints...." Saints are those who have died in the Lord, who believe in Christ as their Lord and Savior, and who will believe in Christ someday. All these people have mystic communion with one another. That is the church's belief and teaching about eternal life and the communion of saints.

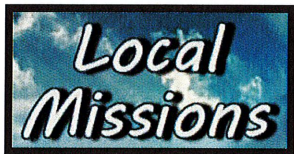
UMW is beginning a new sewing ministry and all are welcome to join.

HELP CHANGE A CHILD'S LIFE THIS CHRISTMAS

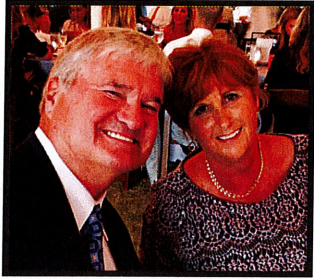
