Then They Prayed...

"All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer."

Acts 1:14

The early church begins with the coming of the rushing power of the Holy Spirit. The disciples had witnessed forty days of the resurrected Jesus eating, teaching and reflecting together on the Old Testament stories. Then, before Jesus ascended into heaven, the followers of Christ were instructed to wait for the power from on high. They waited in Jerusalem close to the epicenter of endings and beginnings. They waited not knowing what the power would look like. They didn't know what the Spirit would do, or what the next steps would look like. They waited for the Holy Spirit not knowing what they would say. There was no way for them to imagine how amazing and challenging their future was about to become when the Holy Spirit would come.

What did they do before knowing the next steps? All of them (the disciples, the women, Jesus' brothers and Mary the mother of Jesus, a crowd numbering 120) were constantly devoting themselves to prayer. I imagine the prayerful poetry of the psalms filled the air along with prayers like the one Jesus taught them to pray. Then after a season of waiting in prayer on the day of Pentecost the mighty power of the Holy Spirit came down. Suddenly filled with Spirit they knew what to say. Suddenly the disciples were speaking of good news to people that the Spirit desired. Filled with the Spirit the early Christ followers began to see what the next steps of God's revolution had for them. Filled with the Spirit the church began to form as they shared what they owned with each other. Suddenly this community by power of the Holy Spirit began to live as a revolutionary reflection of Christ in the world as they healed the sick, fed the hungry and ate with sinners. Led by the Spirit, they crossed boundaries into unexpected places knowing God intends love to be shared even to the ends of the earth.

Before the mighty rush of sound and the tongues of fire, the early followers of Christ constantly devoted themselves to prayer. Prayer became a centerpiece of the early church as they continued together daily. As we begin the Season of Pentecost, I invite us as a church to enter into an intentional 35 days of prayer expecting the Holy Spirit to move and expecting God to act as we trust that the same power that was at work in Christ is raising us up as Christ's holy Church. Starting on Sunday May 23, let us follow the lead of the early church and devote ourselves to an intentional time of prayer seeking the will of God for

35 Day Season of Prayer May 23-June 26, 2021

The story of the early church began with waiting and praying, not knowing what the Holy Spirit would bring. During the Season of Pentecost let's follow the lead of all who have participated in the great movements of God throughout the centuries since the birth of the church and devote ourselves to prayer. We invite all of Camp UMC to use this daily prayer liturgy to guide us as a church in an intentional season of prayer seeking the will of God.

Entrance Into Prayer: Take five slow, deep, breaths centering yourself on the presence of the Holy Spirit.

Opening prayer: Jesus Christ, you are Lord of my life and Lord of Your church. Today we surrender ourselves and Camp United Methodist Church to you. Forgive us when we have resisted You being king of our lives, and forgive us when we have tried to make Your church in our own image. Today we are giving Your church back to You. Amen.

Guiding Question: Jesus Christ, how do you want us to lead this church to the glory of God Almighty?

Scripture Readings: Joining Christians across the world discerning God's will we will use the lectionary scripture readings each week. As you read the scripture reflect on what God is saying to you. This would be a good time to journal your reflections.

HOW DID FLAG DAY START?

It took three presidents to get Flag Day on the government's radar—President Woodrow Wilson issued a formal proclamation for Flag Day in 1916 and President Calvin Coolidge did the same in 1927. But in 1949, Congress finally approved and President Harry Truman signed the national observance of Flag Day on June 14 into law. In his proclamation Truman said "This beloved emblem, which flies above all our people of whatever creed or race, signalizes our respect for human rights and the protection such rights are afforded under our form of government." What is Flag Day to President Truman? It's more than a day to celebrate the physical flag.

FLAG DO'S AND DON'TS

Don't let the flag touch the ground. While handling the flag, it is important to remember to not drop it to avoid it getting damaged. Contrary to popular myth, you don't have to burn your flag if it touches the ground. If the flag is in good condition, it can be displayed.

The flag isn't a costume. Thinking about doing a DIY outfit to show your patriotism? According to U.S. flag code, no part of the flag should be used as sportswear or costume. Instead, opt for a patch or a lapel flag pin, which should be worn over your heart.

Keep it lit. Flags should be displayed from sunrise to sunset on buildings and flagpoles. If you're feeling extra patriotic, you can fly the flag 24-hours a day **if the flag is properly illuminated.** According to the American Legion, proper lighting means the flag is illuminated so it is easily recognizable by others.

DO YOU KNOW THE FLAG'S HISTORY?

According to American legend, in June 1776, George Washington commissioned Betsy Ross, a Philadelphia seamstress, to create a flag for the new nation in anticipation of a declaration of its independence.

NOTE: No official documentation has been found to confirm that Betsy Ross was responsible for creating the very first flag, but it is conceivable that Colonel George Ross—a signer of the Declaration of Independence and her deceased husband's uncle—recommended her for the job. Betsy may also have been acquainted with both Washington and Morris, who were reported to have worshipped at the same church she attended. It has also been established that Ross did indeed make flags, as evidenced by a receipt for the sum of more than 14 pounds paid to her on May 29, 1777, by the Pennsylvania State Navy Board for making "ships colours." 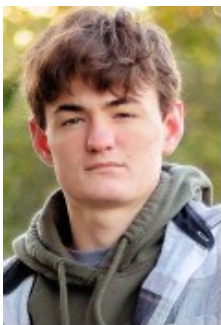

Many of you may know that Alan & Peggy Russ's son, Stan, was in a motorcycle accident several weeks ago. His injuries were serious, but he is home now and on the mend. At the time of the accident, some "God things" happened. Peggy relates the incident below.

ONE WRONG TURN AND THREE ANGELS

On May 2nd, at 5:30PM, Alan Russ received a phone call from a police officer. He told Alan that he was an off-duty policeman and that Stan had been in a motorcycle accident in Marietta, GA.

The police officer had witnessed the accident. He and his wife were on their way home to Alabama from Florida. They had taken a wrong turn, but decided to stay on the road anyway. They came upon Stan. His wife said, "This is one curvy road." Her husband said, "The man on that bike really knows how to ride and handle his bike." Moments later they saw the wreck. The policeman saw Stan's handlebars shaking, and then Stan flew off of his bike rising as high as 2 stories before falling into a ravine.

The policeman, his wife and another motorist (a woman flight attendant who knew CPR) stopped to help. The flight attendant took off Stan's helmet and held his head up so that he could breathe. The policeman's wife held his legs down to keep him still. Stan was unconscious.

An ambulance came and Stan was taken to a hospital. His injuries included a collapsed lung (during surgery the other lung collapsed), a complete break on his coccyx, a cracked neck and 4 broken ribs.

The next day, the policeman's wife was somehow able to contact Peggy's sister, Sherry Stanley, either on Facebook or messenger. She wanted to know how Stan was doing and said that she was praying for him. She also texted her the next day.

If these three strangers had not been at the scene to take charge, the outcome for Stan would most likely have been more dire.

Thank God for his many blessings and for the kindness of strangers!

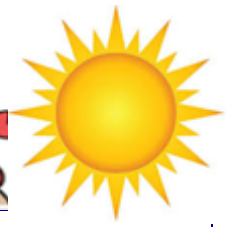
