## Temporary Shepherd

Moses was a shepherd. He knew what it was to tend the sheep that belonged to his father-in-law, Jethro - sheep that were not his own. He was a temporary shepherd tending the sheep for a season. Later Moses would take his shepherd staff to tend and lead a people that didn't belong to him - they belonged to God. Then with God's promised land in sight, Moses came to understand more fully that he was a temporary shepherd. Moses' time of shepherding God's came to an end and Joshua stepped into the role of leading and shepherding God's people, and he too was a temporary shepherd.

United Methodist Pastors and churches are invited into this holy imagination of a temporary shepherd because of our itinerant system. As God's kingdom continues to grow, expand and change, the Holy Spirit will bring a new pastor with his/her own unique gifts and graces to serve a church for a season of time. United Methodist pastors are temporary shepherds who commit to serving wherever the bishop appoints them. The focus is on building up the church as a whole by matching the gifts and graces of pastors and churches in each unique season of life of the church. John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, wrote, "We have found by long and consistent experience that a frequent exchange of preachers is best. This preacher has one talent, that another; no one whom I ever yet knew has all the talents which are needful for beginning, continuing and perfecting the work of grace in a whole congregation."

The Apostle Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 3:6, "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth." Paul knew he was a temporary shepherd and understood being part of something bigger than himself. The church belongs to God and God is the one who gives growth. One gift of the itinerant system is to continually help the church



# ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent, a time when Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline. Although Ash Wednesday has ancient roots, it does not appear in the rituals of The United Methodist Church until the 20th century.

Ash Wednesday emphasizes two themes: our sinfulness before God and our human mortality. The service focuses on both themes, helping us realize that both have been triumphed through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Ashes are an ancient symbol. In Genesis, we read that God formed human beings out of the dust of the earth (*Genesis 2:7*). After expulsion from the Garden of Eden, the first human beings are told by God, “you are dust, and to dust you shall return” (*Genesis 3:19*). Throughout scripture, ashes are part of rituals when people seek forgiveness and mourn their sin.

The imposition of ashes on the heads of Christians to mark the beginning of Lent can be traced at least to the 10th century. Marking the forehead with the sign of the cross is a more recent adaptation.

## WHAT IS THE MEANING OF LENT?

Lent is meant to be a time of repentance and an awareness that sin separates us from God and of what it cost Him to be reunited with us. Repentant sinners seek cleansing from sin, but also freedom from shame.” True repentance leads” to a “180<sup>0</sup> change of direction”. Repentance starts with “regretful acknowledgment of sin with commitment to change.”

## WHAT ARE 3 WAYS A CHRISTIAN SHOULD OBSERVE LENT?

1. **Remove Distractions. (Fasting)** The first way Christians should observe Lent is fasting., the purpose is to draw closer to God by creating a reliance on Him. Traditionally fasting involves food by either fasting all food (drinking water and juice only), fasting 1 meal a day, or fasting a type of food, like meat or sugar. However, fasting from activities, such as, watching television, using Facebook or listening to non-Christian music, also fits within the purpose of removing distractions. Before you decide what to fast, pray and ask God to reveal the idols in your life, i.e. anything distracting you from a deeper relationship with God). Then listen for His prompting on what needs to be fasted from during this season.
2. **Focus on Spiritual Growth (Prayer)** Throughout the Bible, fasting is accompanied by prayer. The two practices work together, especially in observing Lent, to lead us towards spiritual growth. Fasting Begins the process by humbling us before God (see *Psalm 35:13 and Ezra 8:21*). As our idols are torn down, we repent of our sin and receive God’s grace and forgiveness. In our humbled position, we admit our weaknesses and rely on God’s strength. The void caused by our fast is then filled with reading God’s Word and seeking God in prayer. Without distractions, we allow God to meet our needs and bring us fulfillment. When we focus on spiritual growth, Lent creates dedicated time to spend in God’s presence, learning from Him and growing in His ways.
3. **Serving Others (Almsgiving)** Christians should observe Lent by serving others. As we prepare for Easter, we should remember why the Son of God became man in the first place. According to *Mark 10:45*, “*For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.*” **We serve because He served.** “*Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God’s grace in its various forms.*” (*1 Peter 4:10*) Lent is a time of intentional service. When we give of ourselves, our time, money, possessions, or talents, we reflect Christ within us. Serving others becomes the outward sign of the internal work being done through our prayer and fasting.

## YOUTH



## A MESSAGE FROM THE TEAM

Often people will approach us and say, "You are doing wonderful work, how can I help?" We will reply, "We distribute food every first Saturday of the month. Just show up around 9:30AM to help. We typically finish by noon. There are jobs for every skill set from people aged 8 to 80. We are sure we can find you a job that you will be able to do" They will reply, "Oh, I don't want to do that."

Well, here are some simple, mundane things you can do to help:

**Pray for nice weather.** Distributing food in the rain is no fun.

**Bring clean, empty egg cartons to the food pantry.** Every family gets a dozen eggs with their food supply. There are times where we have to buy eggs in "bulk". When that happens, we have to unpack the eggs from a 5 dozen case into egg cartons that hold 12 eggs. We have to buy the empty egg cartons at 13 cents each. Every clean empty carton you bring to the pantry saves us money.

**Ask for paper grocery bags when you shop and bring the bags to the food pantry.** Every item of food is packed in paper grocery bags. We have to buy bags in bulk from a grocery store and while they sell them to us at their cost, we still have to have a cash outlay to purchase them.

**Finally, if you REALLY to help,** become a PORCH food collection site. People Offering Relief (POR) started out in Chapel Hill (CH) - hence PORCH. It started in one small neighborhood by asking their neighbors to bring food to one house and leave it on the front porch. That person would bring all the donated food to a food pantry. The Lord's Pantry gets hundreds of pounds of food and other items every month from the local PORCH sites. This saves is thousands of dollars every year. 


