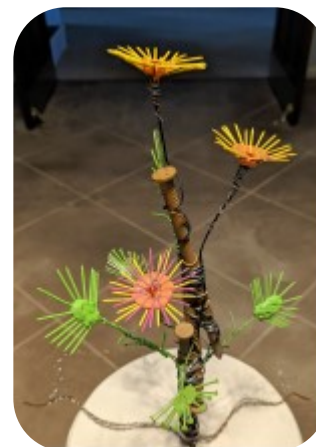

Nails to New Life

Nails. How many nails have been used over the years to build furniture, swing sets, treehouses, homes or other structures. How many times have nails and wood been used to make something useful or something beautiful? Once a nail is set deep in the wood it can be impossible to remove especially without tearing up the wood around the nail.

On Good Friday we heard the sound of nails hitting flesh and wood, not to build something up, but to nail someone down. Evil, doing what it does best, taking something like a nail, something meant for good, and using it in a diminished way to stop the good news of God. On Good Friday we each left with a nail in our hand and were invited to listen to the Holy Spirit reveal where evil has distorted and diminished the good image we were created in. Then on Easter Sunday we are reminded of resurrection. In the hands of our savior the very nails that were used in a way to demonstrate the power of evil, became a witness of what God does in resurrection. Jesus takes what was twisted, and distorted and meant to bring death is transformed into a sign of life. The hope is that the impossibly dark, broken, distorted places of our lives are the very places where resurrection reveals new possibilities, new life, new creation.

I invite you to look at this picture and ponder the sculpture constructed of the nails of Good Friday transformed into a sign of new life. Easter is more than a day - it is a season of the Christian year. A season to ponder the mystery of how Christ is bringing new life to you, me, the church and the world. What places of your life are you hoping that resurrection will be transformed into something beautiful?

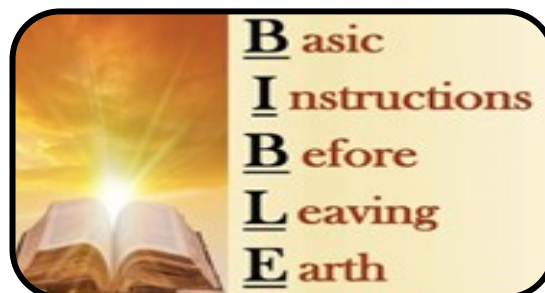

Armed Forces Day was created on August 31, 1949 to replace separate Army, Navy and Air Force Days. The event stemmed from the Armed Forces' unification under one Department of Defense by then-President Harry S. Truman when he signed the National Security Act into law on July 26, 1947.

May 30th - MEMORIAL DAY

Originally called Decoration Day, this holiday originated during the American Civil War, when citizens would place flowers on the graves of those who had been killed in battle. After the Civil War, many cities held observances in May for the families of both Confederate and Union soldiers who had died serving their cause. In 1868, John A. Logan, the commander in chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, promoted a national holiday on May 30th "for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise decorating the graves of those who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion." After WWI, the day came to be observed in honor of those who had died in all U.S. wars and its name changed from Decoration Day to Memorial Day. Since 1971 Memorial Day has been observed on the last Monday in May.

BRUNSWICK COUNTY STREETREACH

The Local Mission Team received a note from Donna Phelps that described the current, dismal situation regarding the current homeless situation in Brunswick County.

There is NO Permanent Shelter, NO public transportation system.

There is a lack of ANY housing & more & more people are moving in.

Currently motel prices are back to summer rates.

For the last 2 weeks, Streetreach has received 4-5 calls daily from individuals seeking emergency help. due to evictions and the influx of new residents.

Many families are trying to hold on until their tax refunds arrive, hoping they can find housing then.

Many individuals doubling up in rentals. Rental amounts have skyrocketed. The rent for some single wide trailers is over \$1500. a month.

Streetreach is stretched to the limit and literally cannot shelter anyone else.

Because many individuals are sleeping in their vehicles, Streetreach is distributing an unbelievable number of restaurant cards, gas cards and \$45 Straight Talk phone cards. **Note:** These homeless individuals and families can receive items from food pantry, but have no way to cook. Without phone cards they can't contact jobs, housing & other needed resources.

The Local Mission team sent Streetreach a \$500 check to help. We are hoping Camp members will assist by donating phone cards, restaurant cards, gas cards or money. If you would like to help, you can place the cards or checks in the collection basket.

For over a year now, The Food Bank of Central and Eastern North Carolina located in Wilmington has provided The Lords Pantry with literally tons of food on a complimentary basis. This has saved the our food pantry thousands of dollars. Now this food source has severely dried up. Between supply chain issues and the war in Ukraine, the Wilmington Food Bank often finds their warehouse empty.

We are sure that your household have seen your expenses rise recently. Our clients face the same Issues and the number of families coming to The Lords Pantry has shown a steady increase. In fact, a recent report from the Wilmington Food Bank stated that 15% of Brunswick County's population is considered to be "food insecure".

One bright spot has been the food donations we receive through PORCH in Brunswick County. PORCH stands for People Offering Relief (POR). It started as a neighborhood food collection in Chapel Hill (CH) and has now grown throughout North Carolina, including Brunswick County. Many local food pantries, including The Lords Pantry, benefit directly from these monthly neighborhood food collection drives. Last month PORCH supplied The Lords Pantry with over **1600 pounds** of food!

PORCH is constantly adding neighborhood food collection points. If anyone is interested in becoming a PORCH site, please contact Jim (252) 904-2326 or Peggy Antunes (910) 579-3288 . They will be happy to explain what is involved.

Finally, we continue to collect clean empty egg cartons and paper grocery bags. Just drop them off in the bin located at the church entrance.

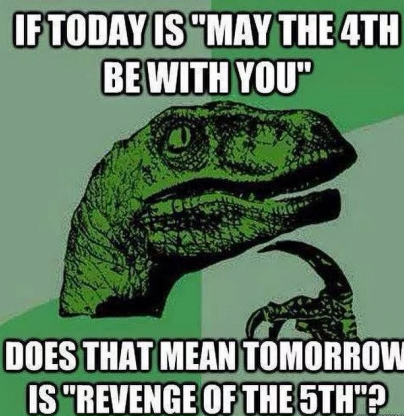
